Theme	What we heard	Council response
Operating hours at Belrose Tennis Club	The respondent asked for confirmation of the club's operating hours.	Council confirms Belrose Tennis Club's operating hours are as follows, in line with the provisions of their Lease: 7am - 10pm, Monday to Sunday
Parking at Belrose Tennis Club	The respondent expressed concern over the availability of parking at the tennis club, specifically the use of Pindrie Place as street parking for the Club.	Council understands and acknowledges the parking constraints at Belrose Tennis Club. Parking is permitted on Pindrie Place as it is a public road. Council has referred the concerns to the Traffic Team to review the parking restrictions in place.

	I refer to your letter of the 26th June and would like to request the following information; 1) Please confirm the club's operating hours 2) There is a pathway between numbers five and six Pindrie Place that leads from the cul-de-sac to the tennis courts. The users of the courts, therefore, invariably park their cars in the cul-de-sac on both sides of the road. This is inherently dangerous for residents and their children.
