



ACTIONS

A. SIGNAGE

Signage is to provide corridor / reserve names & directional, compliance & interpretive information as required (Refer Action 31). Directional signage may include points of interest such as fitness trail, golf club, creek crossing, & declare the reserve as a Wildlife Protection Area if considered. (Refer Action 6).

B. BUSH RESTORATION & HABITAT PROTECTION

Expand the weed eradication & prevention program along South Creek & with the reserve (Refer Action 5).

Undertake an assessment of the reserve to identify potential new areas for bush & habitat restoration. Develop restoration plans for these new areas & any identified endangered communities & remnant habitat areas within the reserve. (Refer Action 2 & 3).

C. CREEK LINE

Improve & stabilise the creek as outlined in the *Floodplain Risk Management Studies & Plans* & the *Warrigah Creek Management Study* (Refer Action 7).

D. EASTERN PATHWAY (SOUTH CREEK RESERVE)

As part of the shared track network develop a pathway in South Creek Reserve. To be located on the eastern perimeter adjacent to South Creek Rd. (Refer Action 23).

E. WESTERN PATHWAY (SOUTH CREEK RESERVE)

As part of the shared track network develop a pathway in South Creek. Western pathway is located on the western perimeter of the reserve & joins the Golf Club path. (Refer Action 23).

F. SHARED ACCESS PATHWAY (SOUTH CREEK FORESHORE)

As part of the shared track network develop a pathway in South Creek Foreshore. As per 2003/0656 DA Cromer Golf Club is to develop a shared pathway through the South Creek Foreshore land & linking to the Council owned South Creek Reserve land south of the Golf Club. (Refer Action 24).

G. PROPOSED CROSSING / BOARDWALK

Provide a bridge or boardwalk crossing over South Creek in the most favourable location. Structure could feature viewing platforms/sheds for observing wetland. (Refer Action 25).

H. ENCROACHMENTS & RUBBISH DUMPING

Develop and implement a program to inform residents of the illegality & impact of dumping and encroachment on public land. This may include increased surveillance and relevant regulatory action. (Refer Action 16 & 53).

I. ROAD CROSSING

Develop appropriate road crossings on Toronto Ave to link proposed pathways & reserve (Refer Action 23).

J. EXISTING WEIR

Under take an environmental impact study regarding the removal of the weir and pumping station in South Creek Foreshore. Remove these structures if recommended. (Refer Action 9).

K. CAR PARKING

Formal parallel car parking is to be developed at various sections along South Creek Road adjacent to South Creek Reserve in conjunction with the shared cycle/walking track. (Refer Action 36).

L. SOUTH CREEK FORESHORE LAND

Investigate obtaining control of the South Creek Foreshore land and the actual creek & establish an agreement with the Golf Club regarding the use of the land. (Refer Action 14 & 15).

M. MAIN ENTRY POINTS

Identify and develop two main entry points to South Creek Foreshore. This could include an entrance from Toronto Ave and a bridge entry from South Creek Reserve. (Refer Action 28).

N. NATURAL AREA BUFFERS

The land is to be managed as a Natural area. All replanting & restoration will be at a measured distance from neighbouring homes leaving a buffer between the vegetation & the houses. Refer Section 5.4.

O. FLOOD RISK MANAGEMENT

This area has been identified as requiring works to lower the risk of flooding. The actual works are outlined in the South Creek Floodplain Risk Management Plan (Refer Action 7).

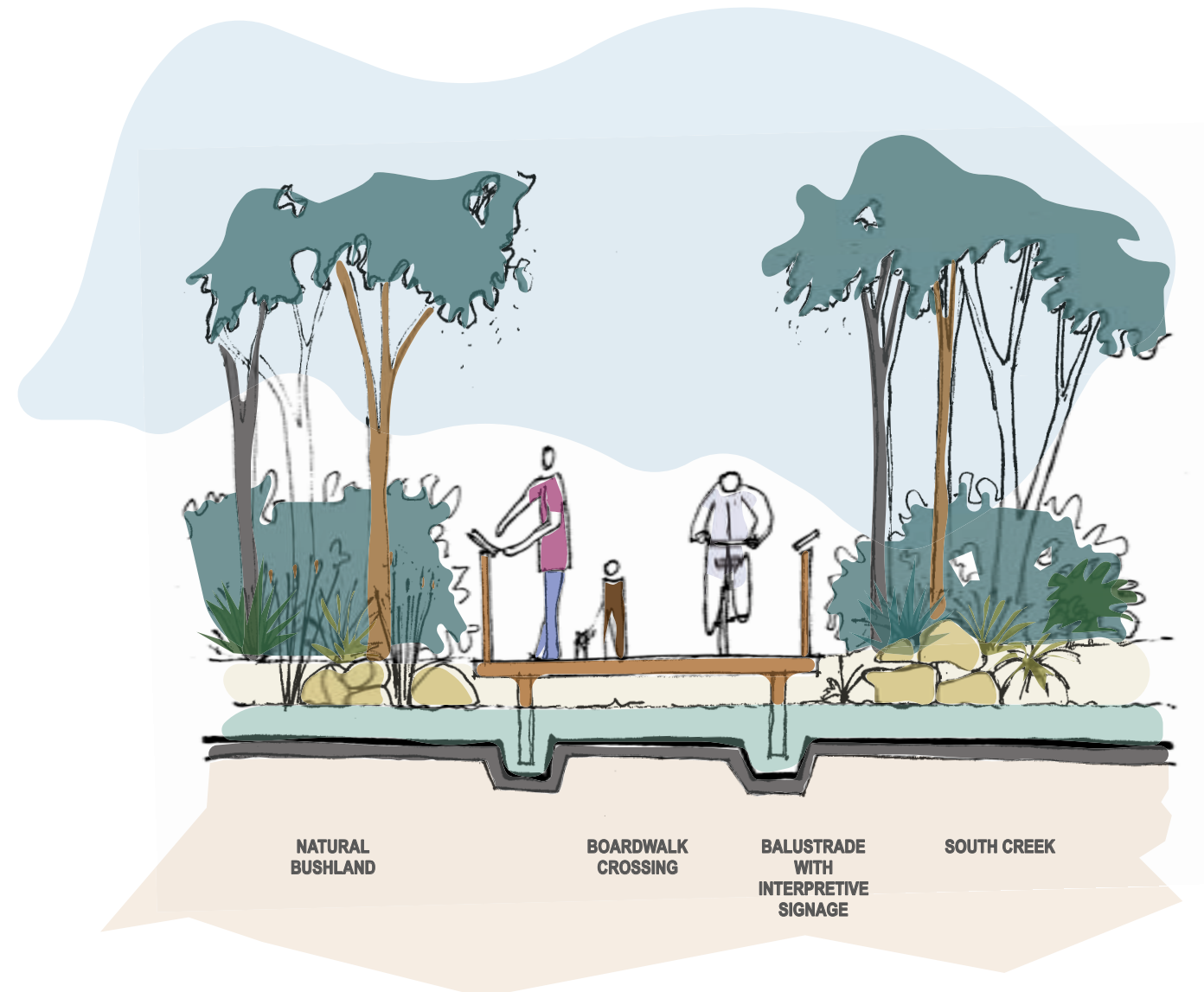

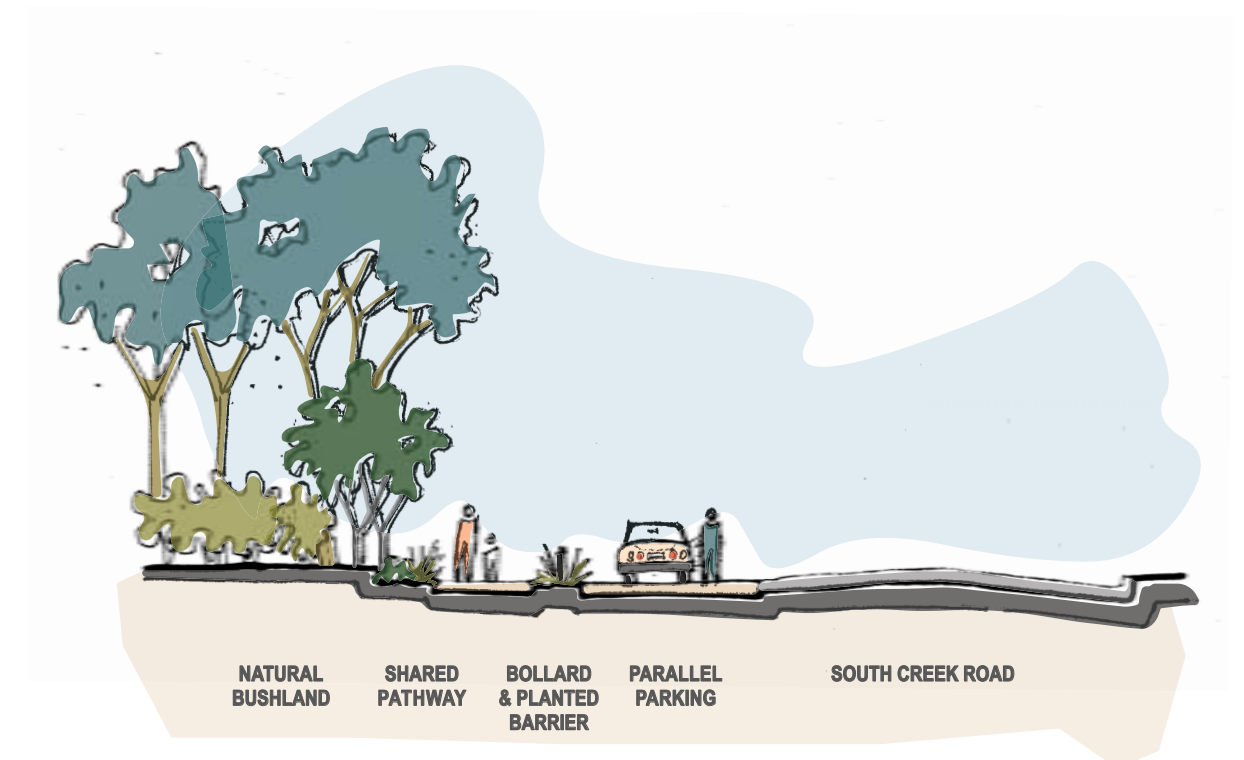

D. SHARED ACCESS PATHWAY

As per 2003/0856 DA Cromer Golf Club is to develop a shared pathway through the South Creek Foreshore land linking to the main shared pathways in Council owned South Creek Reserve land south of the Golf Club. (Refer Action 24).

E. SOUTH CREEK FORESHORE LAND OWNERSHIP & USE

Investigate obtaining control of the South Creek Foreshore land and the actual creek. If trusteeship is acquired a lease, licence or similar agreement is to be established with the Golf Club regarding the use of the land. (Refer Action 14 & 15).
