Calendar of major events

Avalon hosts a range of events throughout the year to encourage visitors to the area. Some of these include:

Council's Avalon Car Boot Sale - a popular event and a great way for residents to sell their pre-loved household goods. This event is held three times a year in March, July and October.

Council and the Chamber also host activations that attract the community and visitors to the areas such as Easter and Halloween Family Trails and late-night shopping for special occasions such as Christmas.

There is also a range of family-friendly activations to draw customers to the area such as the Avalon Market on the Green held at Avalon Bowling Club. Here you will be immersed in a world of artistry with over 70 captivating artisan stalls along with local food and eateries and local music.

For those that are into the festive spirit, the Christmas Carols hosted by the Avalon Surf Lifesaving Club is not to be missed. This is a free family and community event set against the spectacular backdrop of Avalon Beach.

How to get involved

To ensure the success of an event and to deliver a benefit to the local economy, we encourage businesses to participate where they can. This includes opportunities to put on special offers during events and Council regularly seeks expressions of interest from businesses to be involved.

Avalon Family Easter Trail

A recent example of businesses leveraging off Council events in Avalon was the Northern Beaches Council Family Easter Trail.

Northern Beaches Council and local traders invited families to celebrate Easter with the community by inviting them to explore their local centre by way of an Easter Family Trail which ran through the Easter school holidays.

Families were encouraged to explore their town centre in a fun and unique way while visiting local businesses.

How it worked:

Window decals with fun Easter characters were given to participating businesses to display.

Families were encouraged to explore Avalon village and find the Easter characters hiding in business windows then scan the accompanying QR codes.

By visiting each shop and recording the character's name, participants went in the running to win a fantastic Easter hamper.

To support participating businesses, Council created a social tile for each business to use in their own promotion of the event. Council also promoted the Easter Trail to the community through newsletters and social media.

Ferry and buses

Avalon is serviced by Transport NSW buses. Buses to and from Avalon can link up with ferry and Jetcat services to Circular Quay (City) from Manly.

<u>Keoride</u> on demand bus transport service operates in Avalon linking to regular public transport.

Car parking

Guide to small business and the planning system

Have you checked that your business is a permissible use in the area you are planning to locate your business in?

To assist small businesses to navigate the planning system, we have developed a guide which sets out the different pathways that apply to starting or growing a business. This guide explains three planning approval pathways that business owners are most likely to use before they open or expand their business. These pathways are:

- Exempt development (planning permission not required)
- Complying development (fast-tracked approval process by Council's building control team or an external certifier)

• Development application process (standard approval process by Council)

As you read through this guide, you might still find that you have questions, as some planning approval processes are more complicated than others. If this is the case, we always encourage prospective or existing business owners to get in touch to discuss their business circumstances. You can do this by making an appointment with either:

- Our Planning Enquiry Officer
- Our Business Concierge Service

Council have also developed a streamlined version of the standard <u>DA lodgement requirement form</u>, to remove those supporting documents which are not generally required for small business development applications.



Outdoor dining and footpath merchandise

We aim to support a vibrant streetscape that is safe and welcoming, attracting tourists and locals to visit, enjoy and return.

The appropriate placement and regulation of outdoor dining furniture and display of footpath merchandise that ensures safe and equitable access to the footpath can be achieved whilst supporting local businesses.

In order for a premise to have outdoor dining or merchandise displays on the footpath, NSW Government legislation sets out that the following approvals are required:

- All outdoor dining on the footpath requires approval under the Roads Act 1993
- All footpath merchandise displays on the footpath requires approval under the Local Government Act 1993
- Outdoor dining on community lands such as a park or reserve, or Crown Land for which Council manages, requires approval under the Local Government Act 1993.

Council does not allow unauthorised A-frames on public land. Council Rangers regularly patrol to ensure businesses are compliant regarding the placement of bins left in the public domain and unauthorised signage.

If you are looking to open a food business, you will need to notify Council, appoint a Food Safety Supervisor and meet Food Standard Code requirements set out by the NSW Food Authority.

Council also operates a "Scores on Doors" food business hygiene rating program to promote food safety. If your business is looking to serve alcohol, you will need to apply to <u>Liquor and Gaming NSW</u> for an on-premises licence.

Council's grants program

Council offers a range of grants which businesses may be eligible to apply for if they can demonstrate wider community benefits. These include the following categories:

- Community Development Grants
- Environment Grants
- Art and Creativity Grants
- Event Grants and Sponsorship Program
- Placemaking Grants

Grants for businesses are offered by a broad range of State and Federal Government departments and research organisations and cover diverse activities including innovation, research and development, infrastructure, expansion into new markets, training, and inclusive hiring projects.

Service NSW Business Concierge
