# 4.0 REPORTS FOR APPROVAL BY COUNCIL DELEGATION

#### 4.1 DAVIDSON ELECTORATE AND WAKEHURST ELECTORATE - FRENCHS FOREST WARD - FRENCHS FOREST ACTIVE TRANSPORT NETWORK (STAGE 1) -CROSSING FACILITIES

#### PROCEEDINGS IN BRIEF

Mr Michael Lane commented regarding the potential for pedestrians and cyclists to have a false sense of safety and for cyclists to travel at unsafe speeds, particularly-Bikes on shared paths and on approach to crossing points.

Mr Phil Devon informed the committee that Council would be seeking to ensure that the design details were appropriate to manage speeds and ensure safety of all road users. He also noted that E-bike education and an "E-bike code" had been developed. With regard to costs he advised the committee that Stages 1, 2 and 3 will be funded from State Government Grant.

Mr Craig Sawyer advised that there will be warning signage installed for pedestrians on the approaches to pedestrian crossings.

Mr David Musgrove noted that he was very supportive overall of the Active Transport Network plan and noted that it would provide significantly improved connected cycle and pedestrian links to Frenchs Forest, Allambie and Belrose. He also noting how important it is to ensure safety for all regarding the crossing points and that close attention to detail in design would be required. He commented that it would be important to ensure that education and awareness of the project was undertaken in conjunction with the works.

The committee noted the support of the Bicycle NSW representative. Mr Phill Devon advised that Council would be working closely with TfNSW as detailed designs were finalised. He also commented that Council's Road Safety Officers are working closely with the community and particularly local schools, and that there will be VMS boards in place both before and after the construction. Close attention will be given to safety at driveways.

Mr Phil Devon advised that, in the future, where public consultation occurs, Council will endeavour to ensure that the local members are made fully aware of the proposals during the community engagement stage.

The Traffic Committee agreed to support the recommendation subject to TfNSW approval of the designs:

  - b. Kambora Avenue near Prahran Avenue, Davidson (including bus zone adjustment)
  - c. Hakea Avenue near Kambora Avenue, Frenchs Forest (including removal of the slip lane)
  - d. Pound Avenue near Blackbutts Road, Frenchs Forest
  - e. Pringle Avenue near Blackbutts Road, Frenchs Forest
  - f. Prince Charles Road near Adams Street, Frenchs Forest
- 2. Upgrade of an existing crossing to a raised shared-user crossing including associated statutory restrictions at the following locations:
  - a. Mid-Block on Kambora Avenue outside Kambora Public School, Davidson

- b. Blackbutts Road near Mimosa Street, Frenchs Forest
- c. Blackbutts Road near Pringle Avenue, Frenchs Forest
- 3. Upgrade of an existing pedestrian refuge to a raised shared-user crossing including associated statutory restrictions at the following locations:
  - a. Blackbutts Road near Athol Street, Frenchs Forest
- 4. Installation of a continuous footpath treatment (or shared environment intersections) and associated statutory restrictions at the following locations:
  - a. Maitland Street near Prahran Avenue, Davidson
  - b. Richter Crescent near Prahran Avenue, Davidson
  - c. Borgnis Street near Kambora Avenue, Davidson
  - d. Blackbutts Road near Kambora Avenue, Frenchs Forest
  - e. Athol Street near Blackbutts Road, Frenchs Forest
  - f. Nianbilla Place near Blackbutts Road, Frenchs Forest
  - g. Dakara Drive near Blackbutts Road, Frenchs Forest
  - h. Nyorie Place near Blackbutts Road, Frenchs Forest

#### 4.2 MANLY ELECTORATE - MANLY WARD - KENNETH ROAD, MANLY - 6P TIMED PARKING

#### **PROCEEDINGS IN BRIEF**

The Traffic Committee noted that 10P signage is difficult and time consuming to enforce and that 6P signage is also beneficial for local residents and businesses.

The Traffic Committee agreed to support the recommendation

#### TRAFFIC COMMITTEE DECISION - RESOLVED

That the Traffic Committee supports the:

1. Replacement of existing 10P timed parking restrictions on the North side of Kenneth Road east of Addiscombe Road with 6P timed parking restrictions applying 6am to 8pm Everyday.

#### 4.3 PITTWATER ELECTORATE - PITTWATER WARD - RIVERVIEW ROAD, AVALON BEACH - NO STOPPING AND PARKING RESTRICTIONS

#### **PROCEEDINGS IN BRIEF**

The Traffic Committee agreed to support the recommendation.

#### TRAFFIC COMMITTEE DECISION - RESOLVED

That the Traffic Committee supports the:

- 1. Installation of 20m No Stopping Yellow Kerb Line from Shore Brace to the northern edge of the shared driveway at No. 156 166.
- 2. Installation of 20m Two-way Barrier Line (Double Dividing Line) at the bend from the driveway of No. 167 until 15m north of the streetlight pole on the easter side.
- 3. Installation of 52m of No Parking Motor Vehicle Excepted from the end of the proposed Twoway Barrier Line to the southern edge of shared driveway at No. 156 – 166.
- 4. Installation of 37m of No Parking Motor Vehicles Excepted from the driveway of No. 167 south to the existing Two-way Barrier line.

#### 4.4 PITTWATER ELECTORATE - NARRABEEN WARD - 18 THE ESPLANADE, NARRABEEN - PAINTED TRAFFIC ISLANDS

#### PROCEEDINGS IN BRIEF

The Traffic Committee agreed to support the recommendation.

#### **TRAFFIC COMMITTEE DECISION - RESOLVED**

That the Traffic Committee supports the:

1. Installation of Painted Traffic Islands on the eastern side of No. 18's driveway (6m long) and on the western side of No. 20's driveway. The islands will be 4m from the Two-way Barrier Lines at the centre.

#### 4.5 PITTWATER ELECTORATE - PITTWATER WARD - WICKHAM LANE, AVALON BEACH - UPDATE IN TIMED PARKING RESTRICTIONS

#### **PROCEEDINGS IN BRIEF**

The Traffic Committee agreed to support the recommendation.

#### **TRAFFIC COMMITTEE DECISION - RESOLVED**

That the Traffic Committee supports the:

1. Extension in duration for existing Timed No Parking restrictions to apply from 12:00pm (originally 8:00pm) Sunday to 6:00pm Monday.

#### 4.6 PITTWATER ELECTORATE - NARRABEEN WARD - WOORARRA AVENUE, NORTH NARRABEEN - NO STOPPING YELLOW LINE

#### **PROCEEDINGS IN BRIEF**

Councillor Nicholas Beaugeard welcomed Mr David Strange who addressed the Committee.

Mr Strange raised a number of concerns about the information presented in the traffic committee report. This included issues with the data in the report and the accuracy of the accident data provided to the committee.

Councillor Nicholas Beaugeard advised that staff will take Mr Strange's concerns on notice, and asked him to table his documents to assist the Committee with their investigation and response to be tabled at a future meeting.

Councillor Nicholas Beaugeard thanked Mr Strange for his time for addressing the Traffic Committee and he left the room.

The Traffic Committee discussed the matter briefly and resolved to defer a decision on the matter to allow staff to review Mr Strange's concerns, and prepare a further report.

#### **TRAFFIC COMMITTEE DECISION - DEFERRED**

That the Traffic Committee defer a decision on the recommendation below:

1. The retention of the existing unbroken No Stopping yellow line, approximately 15 metres in length, on the northern side of Woorarra Avenue at the intersection of Woorarra Avenue and Carefree Road (frontage of house no. 50 Woorarra Avenue).

# 6.0 GENERAL BUSINESS

#### 6.1 DEE WHY PARADE, DEE WHY

Exit from Dee Why Parade onto Pittwater Road Dee Why.

Paul Murphy advised that cars are currently illegally driving straight through the intersection due to missing arrows on the pavement and requested that the right lane be marked as right turn only.

Samantha Morley advised TfNSW are remarking the arrows, she will follow up.

#### 6.2 CONDAMINE STREET, BALGOWLAH

Phill Devon advised that he has met with Mr Rob Thompson a resident of Condamine Street earlier today (4/2/25) to discuss ongoing concerns of residents on Condamine Street (east side North of Clarence Street) regarding substandard vehicle access to their properties. Mr Devon noted that the issue was further impacted by a blocked pipe and construction work on one of the impacted properties. He advised that he will be meeting with Council's Assets team late this week to discuss progress and handover of the project.

## 6.3 BELGRAVE STREET, MANLY

Adele Heasman raised a concern about the Belgrave Street traffic lights at East Esplanade.

She reported that concerns were often raised that the green light for traffic is appearing too early, causing safety concerns for pedestrians trying to complete their crossing.

Samantha Morley advised that she has spoken with TfNSW Network Operations about this matter and is still waiting to hear back from them on whether it is possible to provide greater separation between pedestrian and vehicular phases OR if not, if there other changes that can be made
